The **Racial Justice Fellows Program** at the Center for Racial Justice and Equitable Futures creates a pathway for Cornell students to be directly involved in efforts to advance systemic change. The program will help to cultivate a new generation of leaders who can help build a more just and equitable society. Fellows are selected in the spring and begin their fellowship in the fall.

Eligibility

- Master's and PhD students at Cornell during the upcoming academic year
- Can be from any school/major
- No GPA or citizenship requirement
- Must demonstrate an interest in and experience with research, engagement, or activities related to racial justice
- Must commit to full participation in the fellows program
- Must provide the names and contact info of at least two Cornell based references

Roles, Responsibilities, Benefits

Fellows will contribute to the life of the Center in a wide range of capacities, including (but not limited to) participating in center events and activities, collaborating with faculty and community partners on research projects related to racial justice and equity, and engaging student programming.

All fellows will be expected to work with the Center throughout the academic year. This includes attending fellows' meetings, being active participants in Center events, and working on Center-related research and engagement activities. Fellows will be given mentorship and leadership opportunities, will gain experience with faculty and partner research projects, and may have opportunities to develop their own research projects. Fellows will receive \$750 per semester.
